Take the Big Data Talent Gap Survey

Ryerson University has established Canada's first national, multi-sector, and multi-industry project to study the Big Data and Advanced Analytics talent gap in Canada. The objective is to determine whether a talent gap exists, what is the nature of the gap and how to develop strategies to help close it. The outcomes of the project will be released in a white paper, available to all
