2015/2016 THEMES

In this complex and transformative federal ICT landscape, ITAC members need a broad understanding of the opportunities that exist within departments; along with an understanding of the overarching vision across government.

As a result, our executive briefings for 2015/2016 will focus on two areas:

Leadership & Direction

- ITAC would like to engage the new leadership within Shared Services Canada (SSC) and Treasury Board Secretariat (TBS);
- Our members want to remain connected to the plan, and priorities of key government delegates driving the ICT modernization agenda; and
- ITAC will provide a platform for government to engage industry and share its ICT vision for the Government of Canada.

Horizontal Solution Delivery

- ITAC would like to engage the CIO communities, by departmental portfolio, and/or commonality;
- Securities, sciences, and social portfolios are of significant interest;
- Our members want a better understanding of the business enablement horizontal solution delivery opportunities that remain within these departments; and
- ITAC will provide a platform to ignite government-industry talks to foster future horizontal solution delivery discussions/opportunities.

- ITAC aims to host these executive briefings quarterly;
- Held within hotel conference facilities in downtown Ottawa;
- Networking Breakfast will start both events and run from 7:30am – 8:30am;
