As discussed, the IT skills gap is a reality our sector is facing, we have continually addressed this issue and it is fast becoming business as usual. The IDC study highlighted in our meeting (also attached) identifies that Canada currently has 54,000 unfilled positions due to this skills gap and will grow by 15% by the end of 2016.

Further dialogue is needed so we can best explain what our sector is doing to address the skills gap, fuel interest in the STEMs, all while increasing the number of women and supporting diversity within our industry.

With your help, ITAC can be a strong partner and an industry association sought after for constructive advice on how Canada can move its Digital Agenda forward. With time, we will be driving the knowledge economy and growth in Canada and making Canada's Innovation Agenda a reality.
