As a reminder, [ADaPT](#) is a skills development program that equips recent graduates (Undergrad and Masters programs) with in-demand skills (professional and digital). After completing 70 hours of hands-on workshop training, they are placed in meaningful employment which varies from entry level full-time, contract and internships within information, communication and technology (ICT) roles. Positions can range from a Data & Business Analyst, to Digital Marketing, to Technical Sales and Call Centre, Developers. The list is extensive!

Participants come from a variety of different educational backgrounds and from many underrepresented groups.

A key focus area for our Association is talent – helping organizations better anticipate and respond to the demands of today's workforce and access a whole new pool of talent, while simultaneously addressing the underemployment problem for recent graduates.

TECHNATION and Ryerson University's Diversity Institute are collaborating on a skills development and work placement initiative that helps to bridge the employment gap for recent graduates. Our aim is to deliver this Program on a national basis.

The end goal is to launch a “tool” that can be used by organizations across the country to draw the right talent needed to help them succeed and grow.

Your feedback will enable us to offer accessible and scalable delivery approaches in diverse contexts to equip post-secondary students with the skills they need to enhance their employment opportunities in the ICT sector. Once this methodology has been applied in cities across the country, the *ADaPT Program* will then be offered on a national scale.

Rigorous skills testing and assessment of aptitude, competencies and skill development are also key components of the Program.

It might also interest you to know that in addition to creating curriculum, TECHNATION and the Diversity Institute are also seeking to:

- Recruit new talent pools to address skills shortages in the ICT sector.
- Improve employment and income opportunities.
- Increase inclusion of under-represented groups.
- Test new effective and affordable models and pathways to employment.
- Provide alternative pathways into ICT roles for students from non-STEM programs.

As an industry leader, your participation is integral to this national initiative. It allows you to be involved in cutting-edge research that will change how Canadian talent is developed and grown so we can stay competitive in an ever-changing global economy.
